



### **How did Paxos Animal Welfare Society (PAWS) do during 2025?**

During 2025 250 female cats and 228 male cats were neutered.

Twenty one (21) kittens were rescued, some of them newborns from which eleven (11) were adopted. The rest are being living within PAWS yard enjoying warm little shelters and good food.



Forty one cats and two abandoned dogs were operated for various reasons. More specifically PAWS vet teams performed sixteen (16) dental ops, seven (7) eye ops, two (2) amputations and eleven (11) animals were put to sleep. Quite a few animals were treated for cat flue and other issues at PAWS clinic undergoing medication from 5 to 15 days depending on each case.

Two dogs were removed from their “owners” due to abuse. One of them, named Hero by our vet team, passed away after more than a month’s efforts by our vets and volunteers due to old age and many very grave illnesses. The second one, Roxy is hosted at Paws undergoing treatment for heartworm for the last 2 months. Her treatment will hopefully be completed by March 2026, after which she will be neutered and given up for adoption.

Through PAWS Voucher program twenty one (21) privately owned dogs and eighty (80) cats were neutered at the two private vet clinics of the island. The Voucher program was funded by international animal charities, while PAWS spent 3265 euro to help encourage pet owners to neuter their animals.

PAWS managed to raise funds to purchase 4 new treatment stainless steel cages, 3 new cat traps and 4 new carriers in order to enhance tnr procedures for stray cats on Paxos and offered more than 50 microchips to the municipal clinic.

PAWS improved some of the clinic’s infrastructure (floor of the surgery room, toilet facilities, preparation room). Our charity paid vet Nefeli Damigou’s fees for neutering days at the municipal clinic, the fee and all expenses for vet Lefteris Gallidis, who neutered stray cats for a week in April 2025 and finally paid travelling and accommodation costs for volunteer vet and vet nurses teams who worked at the clinic during the summer months.

PAWS expenses during 2025 reached the amount of 41.226 euros, mostly spent to assure the best possible veterinary services offered to stray cats and dogs on the island (trapping, neutering, vaccinations, deworming, microchipping, operations, treatment, good quality food, long term treatments, purchasing of equipment for the clinic, fees, travelling and accommodation expenses for all our vet teams, renting a cottage for our vet nurses during summer months etc).

PAWS income reached the amount of 42681 euro for year 2025 from which the amount of 16.178,36 euro came from grants from international animal charities and 26.503 euro came from donations in Greece and abroad.

PAWS has created 44 feeding stations all over Paxos and Antipaxos and has a volunteers network of 23 residents.

Our charity has hosted and guided around the clinic facilities on Wednesdays school children of different ages again in 2025, talking to them about how to be a responsible pet “parent”, about the importance of neutering, of

microchipping, on how to look after stray cats in their neighborhood during cold days or very hot days etc.

We owe an enormous thank you to all our volunteers for working hard on tnr every week, cleaning the clinic, looking after our ill strays under hosted in the clinic, picking up ill or injured strays from all over the island, using their own cars and without any compensation or fee from the Municipality.

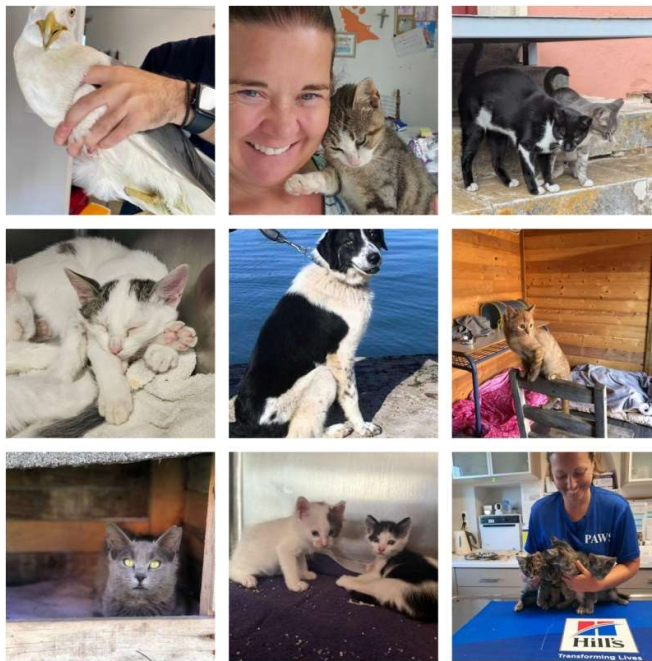
We also owe a thank you to the Municipality of Paxos for paying electricity and water bills for the clinic, part of our local vet's fees, large amount of cat food for our strays.

Our gratitude also goes to all our lovely vets and vet nurses who helped keep our veterinary services to a high standard especially during the summer months.

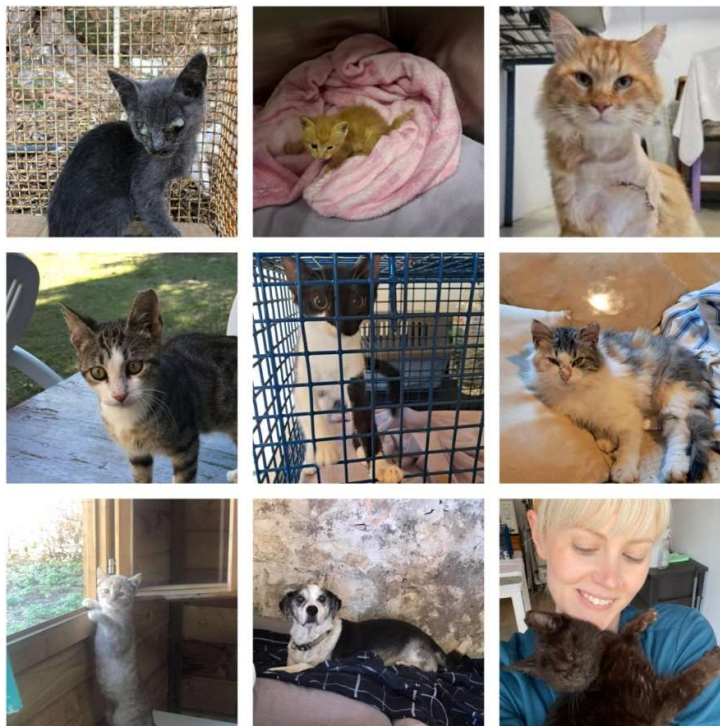
